## 1. Inauguration Address from the New President

### “Society trusted and selected by regional scientists”

#### Yoshiaki Ohsawa, The 17-th President of the ARSC

It is my great honor to be the president of ARSC for two years, 2019-2020.

I am from the University of Tsukuba. Since student days, I have received instruction from Prof. Noboru Sakashita (the first president), Prof. Koji Mera (the second president), Prof. Yoshitsugu Kanamoto (the 8th president), Prof. Takatoshi Tabuchi (the 12th president) and Prof. Ryohei Nakamura (the 14th president). Also, at conference presentation and workshops held at universities, I always received friendly guidance from Prof. Komei Sasaki (the 5th president) and Prof. Tatsuaki Kuroda (13th president). Therefore, it is a great honor to be the president of the ARSC. I would make my best efforts to ensure steady development of the ARSC, with the help from the vice president, members of the steering committee, and individual members.

Most local governments in Japan are facing social issues such as population decline, aging and financial difficulties. Policies in high-growth era, such as infrastructure development, have become obsolete. The ARSC, which was established in 1987, also faces similar problems such as member decline, member aging, and severe fiscal management. In the general meeting last year in Nagoya,

the deprecation of the international journal RURDS (Review of Urban and Regional Development Studies) was decided, which has published many outstanding research findings. Although the financial situation of the conference has been improved by that, the continuation of ARSC is threatened by the steadily decreasing number and aging of members.

A virtuous circle may have been formed among academia, industries, and governments. Responding to the 4th Industrial Revolution, Society 5.0, Smart City and Super City. This is a tailwind for the ARSC that places a significance on evidence-based policy making if we can manage to face technologies such as AI and Big Data. In the local areas, there is a demand for market-based structural transformation such as productivity improvement of local industries. By taking advantage of the market principles, local governments and industries can recognize the significance of the scientific society and promote the industry-government-academia collaboration.

There is a demand for talents who can lead the local regions and work between governments and private firms. One of the options, is to consider the ARSC as a saucer of re-learning of adult students (recurrent education). If the adult education effect is enhanced via conference presentation, it may not only lead to the growth of member number but also accelerate the diversity of the conference.

In the coming ARSC annual meeting to be held this fall at Saga University, we will establish the Early Bird Award to support the younger generation. In order to become a “society trusted and selected by regional scientists”, I hope in the general meeting at Saga, all of you can propose adventurous opinions and suggestions about the development of the ARSC.

## 2. Election Result for Vice President

The election for the Vice President of ARSC was held by the postal voting ended on March 15 2019. Professor Makoto Okumura (Tohoku University) was elected. His term, as a vice president, is from April 2019 to March 2021.
